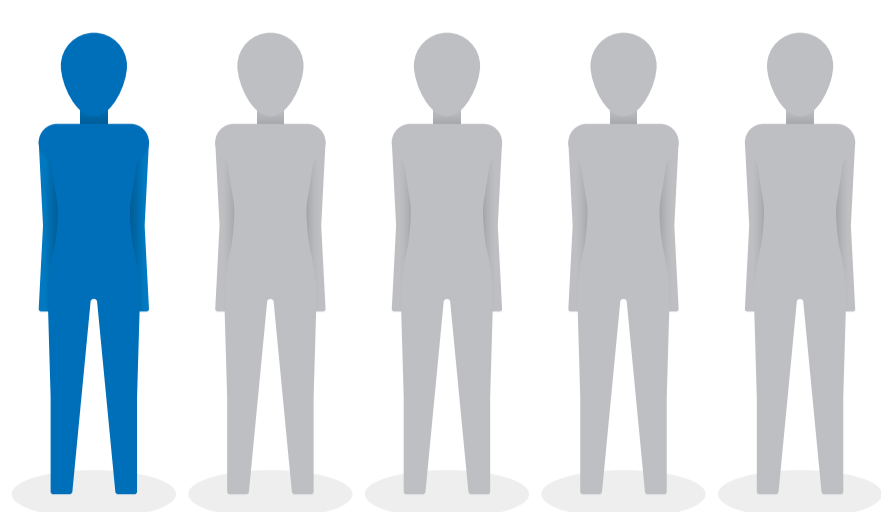


Treating lung cancer

The big picture

Lung cancer has been the most common cancer in the world for several decades, accounting for



1 in 5
of all cancer deaths¹

Worldwide, **two** people die from lung cancer every minute



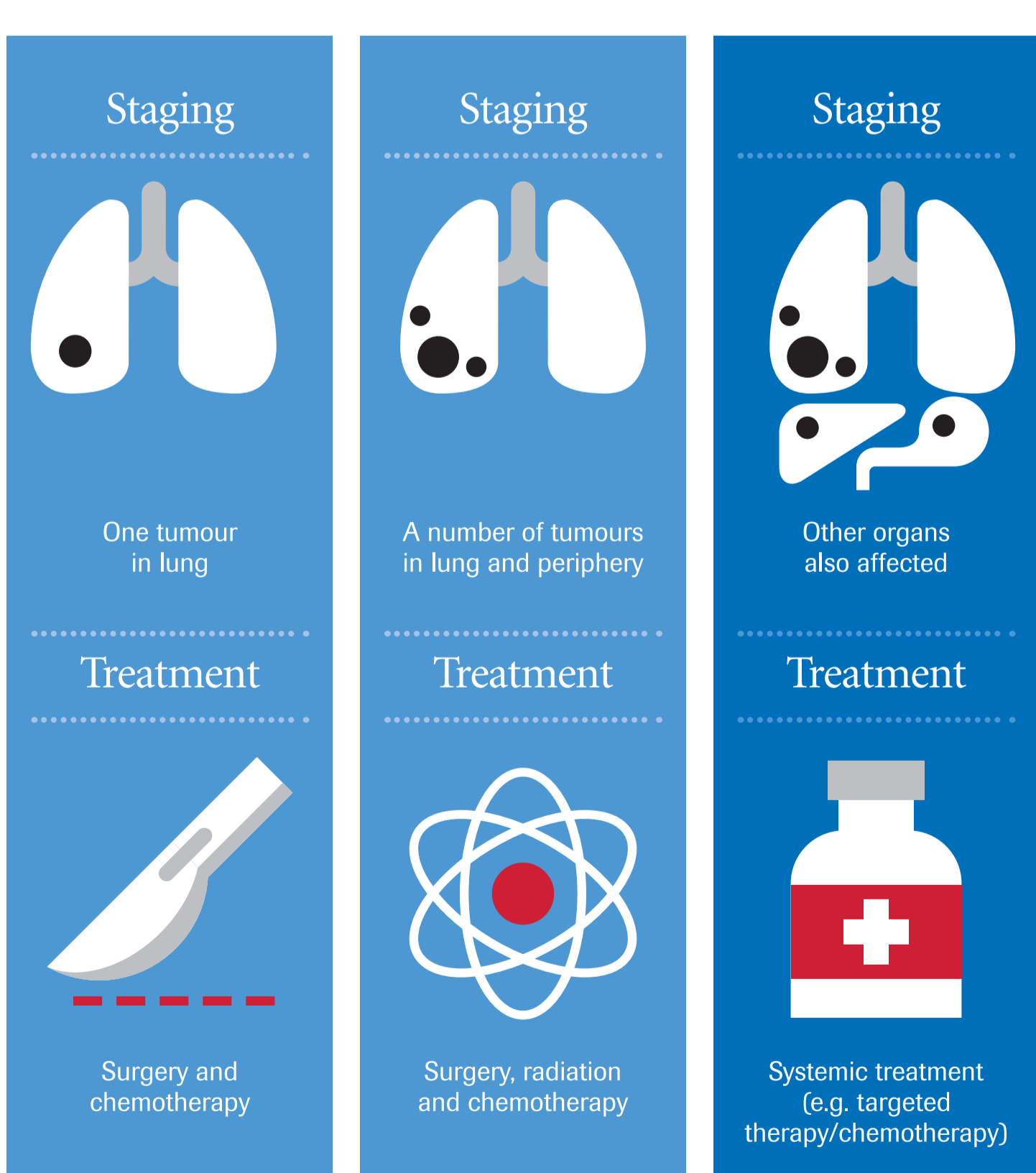
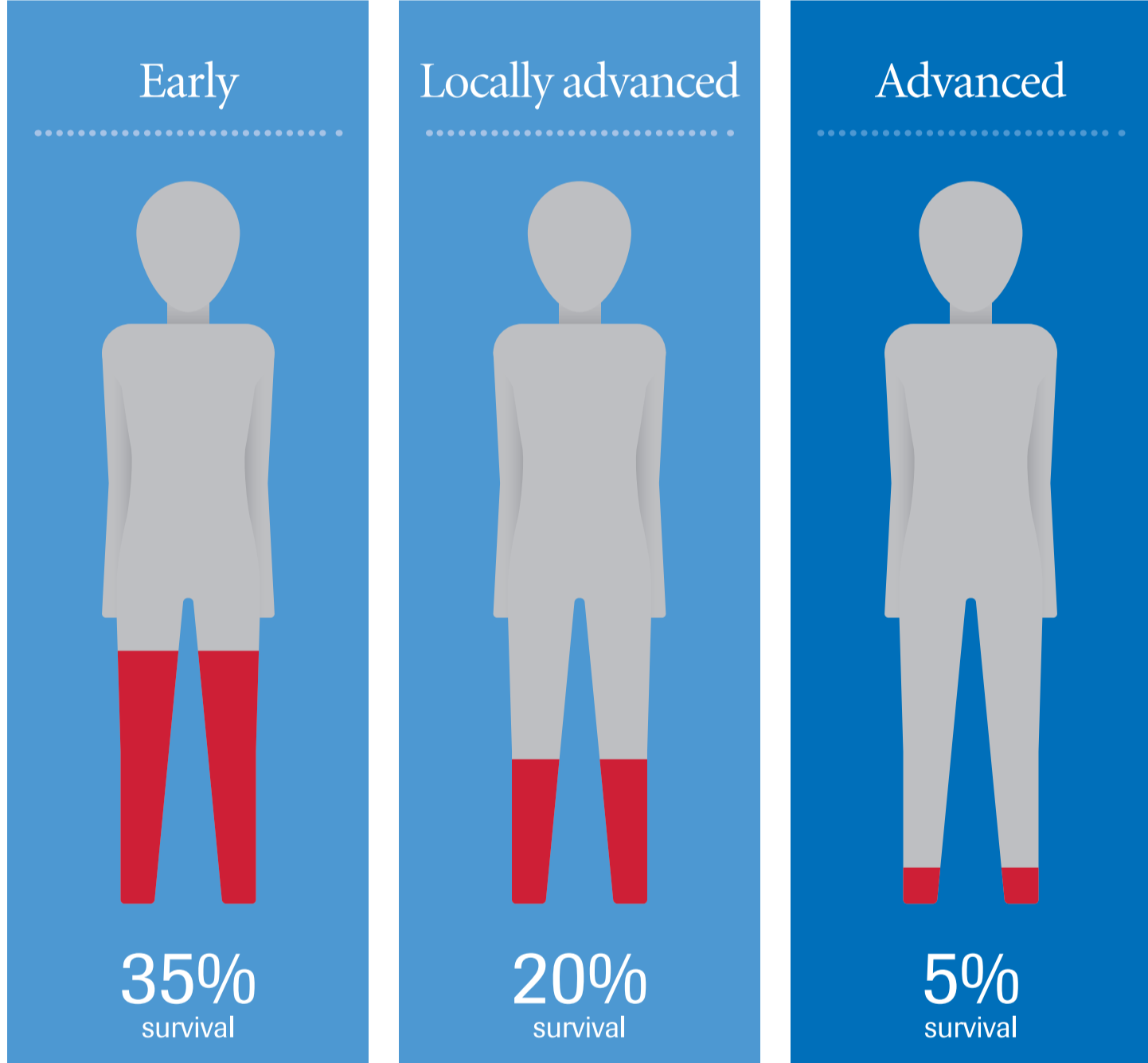
This is more per year than breast, colorectal and prostate cancer combined



Diagnosis, staging & treatment²

More than **2/3** of patients are diagnosed with lung cancer at a **later stage** when their survival chances are lower

Instances Survival %



During later stages of lung cancer **systemic treatments are key.**



Of these systemic treatments, targeted therapies e.g. **monoclonal antibodies** have demonstrated survival benefits for patients
